<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Choose ten words to look up in the dictionary and write down the definitions. 5 points2. Make a crossword puzzle with ten of your spelling words. Your crossword must include the definitions. 5 points3. Sort your words into parts of speech. Record your sort and turn it in for points. 5 points4. Use the dictionary to divide your words into syllables. Copy the divided words on a piece of binder paper. 5 points 	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Make a word search on graph paper using spelling words. 5 points2. Write the alphabet down the left side of your paper. Beside the letters, write the numbers 1 through 26. Choose ten words you think will have the greatest value. Assign numbers to these ten words' letters and then add up the numbers to see how high each word totals. 5 points3. Design a key and write all of your words in code. Include the code with the words. Have your parents or someone in your spelling group decode your list. 5 points4. Scramble the words and have a student in your spelling group or someone at home unscramble the words. Turn in your finished sheet. 5 points
